

Capel Golf Course



**1st 331 Metres
Par 4 Index 6**

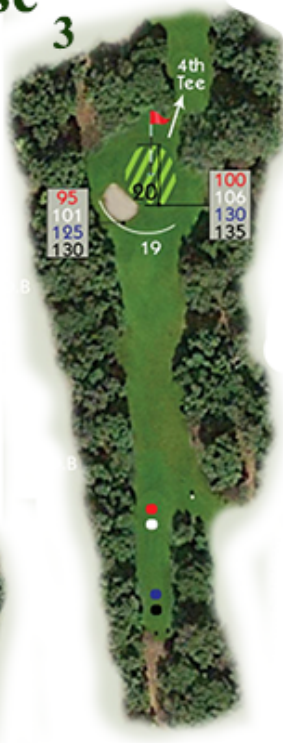
To position yourself for the best approach to the green take your driver or 3 wood down the right side of the fairway.

From there it is a short iron shot uphill to a green guarded by a bunker at the front. Don't go long.



**2nd 369 Metres
Par 4, Index 4**

This hole demands accuracy off the tee with a generous landing area. Tall trees left and right will penalise any errant drive. The green slopes up from front to back so leave your approach shot below the hole for an easier putt. Bunkers left and right of the green await a misdirected shot.



**3rd 145 Metres
Par 3, Index 12**

A good mid iron shot into a tight landing area is required here.

A bunker front left needs to be avoided.

**4th 395 Metres
Par 4, Index 2**

A long drive will leave you with a mid to long iron shot into the green. If the sea breeze is blowing then an extra club or two will be required. A mis-directed drive could lead to a big score on this hole.



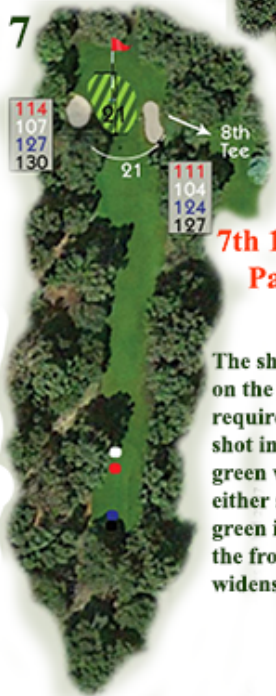
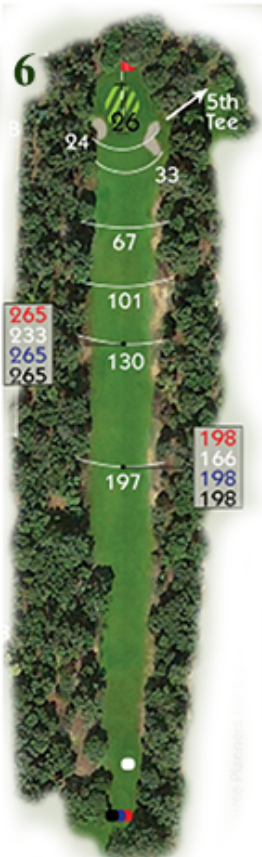
**5th 486 Metres
Par 5, Index 16**

A fairway bunker on the right awaits at 220m from the tee. To have the best chance of reaching the green in two, the drive needs to start down the left and fade to the middle of the fairway. From that point you can either lay up or the brave can go for the green. Beware of the green side bunker on the left.



**6th 331 Metres
Par 4, Index 8**

This dogleg-left hole demands accuracy off the tee. A well placed 3 wood will leave a short iron into a well guarded green protected by a bunker front right.



**7th 141 Metres
Par 3, Index 18**

The shortest par 3 on the course requires a mid-iron shot into a generous green with bunkers either side. The green is narrow at the front and widens at the back.



**8th 471 Metres
Par 5, Index 14**

The dogleg right par 5 plays similar to the 5th hole, with a drive starting down the left side and fading to the middle of the fairway for the best start. The bunker can be flown with a long drive to a downhill landing area. This will leave a shot of approximately 220 metres to a green which is guarded by a bunker front left and surrounded by peppermint trees right and back.



**9th 326 Metres
Par 4, Index 10**

A wide fairway awaits on the 9th, so go with the driver to leave a short iron or wedge for your second shot. It's good advice to take a club more than you think, as an approach that falls short could end up in the bunker front left that has a steep face. The green slopes from back to front so best option is to leave your approach below the hole.

10
10th 323 Metres
Par 4, Index 13

This dogleg left needs to be played with some thought. Take a driver off the tee and you may end up running out of fairway. A long iron or hybrid is required to the corner leaving a short iron into a green protected by a bunker front right. The green slopes from back to front which provides a stern test in itself.

11th 497 Metres
Par 5, Index 9

The longest par 5 on the course, this straight hole will take three good shots to reach the green for most.

A fairway bunker on the left side is in play for all players as well as another front left of the green. Treat this hole with respect and it will reward.



12
12th 154 Metres
Par 3, Index 17

Playing from a raised tee, this downhill par 3 has bunkers left and front right which will penalise the short shot. For an easier putt the best play is to be below the hole.



13
13th 379 Metres
Par 4, Index 5

The first of four par 4s in a row that will sort a good score from a bad one. This slight dogleg left is best played down the right-hand side of the fairway. Bunkers protect a sloping green. If your approach ends above the hole it will leave a difficult putt back down the hill.

14
14th 383 Metres
Par 4, Index 3

This is the longest hole of this difficult run. To have a shot at the green your drive needs to find the fairway, which has a generous landing area. The left-hand side of the fairway is best for your approach to the green.



15
15th 361 Metres
Par 4, Index 7

The shortest of the four par 4s on this stretch is certainly not the easiest. Drives need to be precise on this dogleg right with a small landing area for the big hitter. Put your drive in the bush and you will struggle to make par. Bunkers left, right and back protect a green full of subtle breaks.

15th 361 Metres
Par 4, Index 7

16
16th 377 Metres
Par 4, Index 1

Dogleg left with a grass mound on the outside of the corner that is in reach. Find the fairway and you will face a slightly uphill approach that requires one more club than you think. The real challenge starts when you reach a sloping green right to left where three-putts are common.



17
17th 185 Metres
Par 3, Index 11

The signature hole of Capel Golf Club. A downhill long iron tee shot to a narrow but deep green with bunkers left and right. Par is a good score here. Players tend to play short and straight to allow a chip to a raised green. Confident players try to land the ball on the green. Bunkers may wreck a good score.



18
18th 452 Metres
Par 5, Index 15

A tough finishing hole that doglegs to the left at 210 metres. There is a bunker on the outside of the corner at 230 metres from the tee, land in it and you will do well to make par.

The green is uphill and protected by two deep bunkers.
