



1st 313 Metres
Par 4 Index 8

A slight dogleg to the right from an elevated tee. Big hitters should go over the trees on the right edge of the fairway. With trouble left, this blind but short par 4 requires only a well placed lay-up to the middle of the fairway to start your round off safely. Otherwise, stay to the right of the fairway as a long drive can run off to the left. The hole is heavily guarded by trees on both sides of the pond on the back right of the green.

Tip: Don't overshoot this sloping green.

4th 163 Metres
Par 3, Index 16

A long par 3 with trouble mostly to the left, requiring a long and straight ball off the tee. The hole slopes uphill so normally requires one club more. A sandpit at the back left of the green and thick undergrowth to the left of the fairway with Out of Bounds will punish wayward shots. The beautiful grove of paperbarks to the right of the fairway has been known to make cut tee shots disappear.



7th 445 Metres
Par 5 Index 14

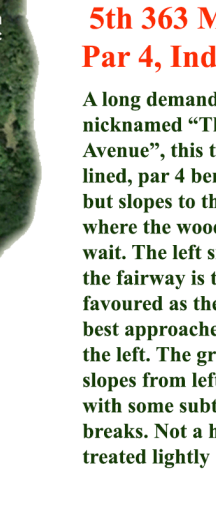
A straight, wide fairway with a creek running across the fairway about 80 metres from the green and a pond to the right front of the green. Lay-up your 2nd short of the creek or take on the pond and tricky winds around the green. A good tee shot will allow for the second shot to clear the creek, setting up a birdie chance. This hole can be punishing if not treated with respect. Safety is the key for not ending up in the water or thick bush on the right of the fairway. The green is quite fast and slopes from left to right.

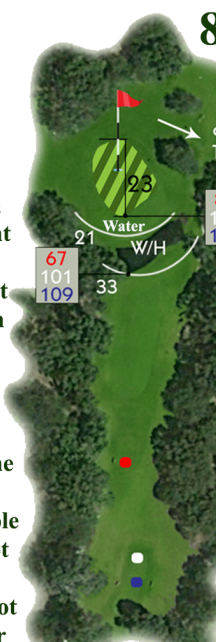
2nd 471 Metres
Par 5, Index 4

This relatively benign par 5 can be won or lost off the tee. With the wind usually at your back, a high fade left of centre is ideal as the ball will tend to roll off to the right, preventing a straight approach to the green. There is lateral hazard to the right off the tee and out of bounds to the left when nearing the green. The deep green slopes down to the left from back to front.



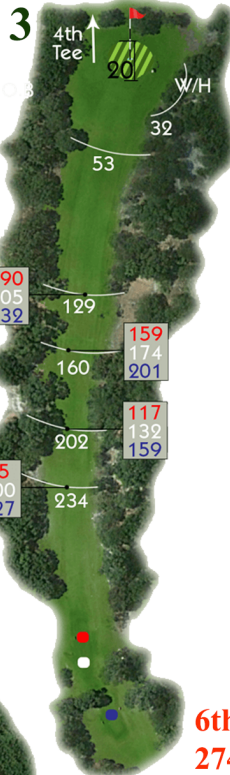
5th 363 Metres
Par 4, Index 6

A long demanding hole nicknamed "The Avenue", this tree lined, par 4 bends left but slopes to the right where the woods lie in wait. The left side of the fairway is to be favoured as the green is best approached from the left. The green slopes from left to right with some subtle breaks. Not a hole to be treated lightly



8th 134 Metres
Par 3, Index 18

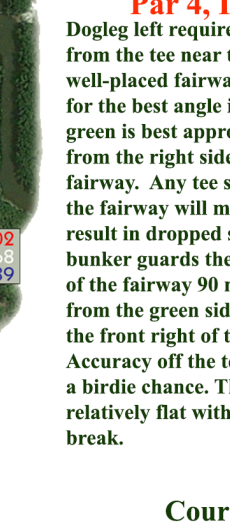
A creek line 10 metres before the green guards the approach to the green which slopes from back to front. Most probably the easiest hole on the course to par. More holes-in-one here than any of the other short holes – just stay out of the water!



3rd 334 Metres
Par 4, Index 10

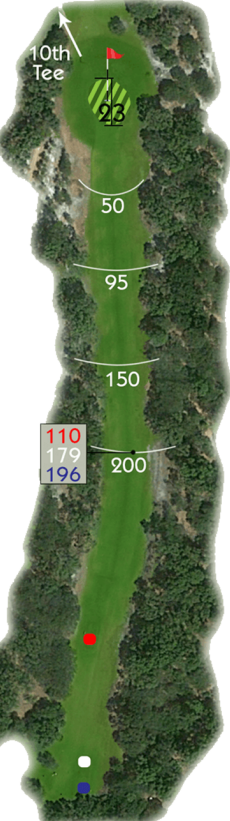
This left to right dogleg par 4 again requires a down-wind fade left of centre. There is not much room for error with your drive from the tee. Out of Bounds is on the left but most of the damage is done on the right. A pond to the right of the green and a raised grass area to the left completes this demanding hole.

Tip: This wide green looks a little closer than it is.



6th 274 Metres
Par 4, Index 12

Dogleg left requires a lay-up from the tee near to the well-placed fairway bunker for the best angle in. The green is best approached from the right side of the fairway. Any tee shot left of the fairway will most likely result in dropped shots. A bunker guards the right edge of the fairway 90 metres from the green side bunker the front right of the green. Accuracy off the tee provides a birdie chance. The green is relatively flat with not much break.



9th 379 Metres
Par 4, Index 2

The prevailing wind usually makes this long par 4 even longer. A slight dogleg left does not favour hooked tee shots. There is a small grass trap to the left about 80 metres from the green to avoid. The green is very fast and slopes from the back left to the right front with some big breaks, depending on pin placement. More bogeys here than any other hole on the course.

Tip: If you can't make the green in two, be sure to putt from below the hole on this tricky green.

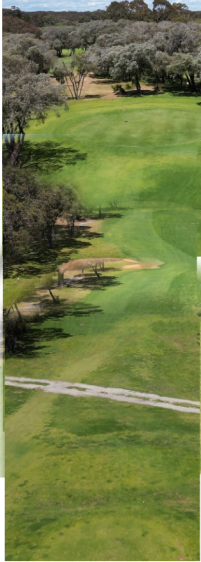

10th 308 Metres
Par 4, Index 11

A short par 4 well guarded by a large bunker on the left side of the fairway approximately 100 metres from a slightly elevated green. The tee shot should be middle-right as the fairway funnels down to the bunker waiting on the left. The green slopes from left to right and offers birdie opportunities if reached in regulation.

11th 368 Metres
Par 4, Index 1

Without the wind helping, this par 4 is sneaky long. One of the hardest holes on the course. Accuracy off the tee is a must as the fairway is tree lined on both sides. A lake in front of the men's tee can be a distraction for some. A deep bunker guarding the sloping green has beaten many. The very fast green slopes from front to back left with big breaks, depending on pin position. Steep slopes to the left of and behind the green can punish those overshooting the green

12th 178 Metres
Par 3, Index 13

This long par 3 is harder to hit than many think with its narrow neck and false front. The fairway slopes from right to left with a green side bunker to the left of the green. There is a hazard running the length of the fairway on the left and unforgiving trees on the right. At the back of the green, a severe slope will punish overshooting this hole.

13th 456 Metres
Par 5, Index 5

Another shortish par 5 but the green is a tougher target than first thought with a hungry fairway bunker on the right hand waiting 30 metres out. A birdie potential for the longer hitters. A slight dog leg from left to right with a severely sloping fairway to the right toward a water hazard. The green is two tiered and slopes from left to right. The top tier presents with some difficult breaks.

14th 491 Metres
Par 5, Index 3

The longest hole on the course requires a tee shot to the middle of the fairway. With its generous fairway, this par 5 is all about setting up your third with a well placed lay-up over the hill. The right side of the fairway slopes toward the infamous "coal hole". Watch out for the deep bunker guarding the green which slopes from right to left

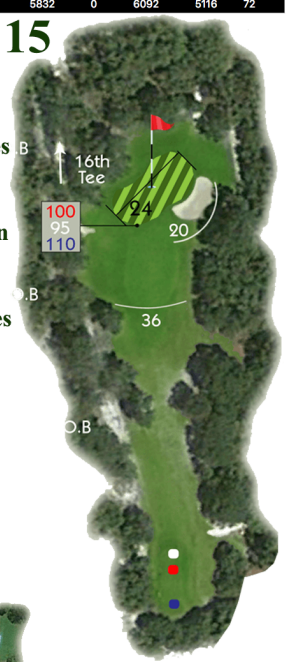

15th 113 Metres
Par 3, Index 17

A deceiving hole, requires accurate club selection. This elevated, two-tiered green is more sloped than it looks. Usually into the wind and uphill, the cavernous bunker catches more than its fair share! Thick bush to the right and out of bounds to the left. A steep bank at the back of the green with a big slope from left to right.

16th 378 Metres
Par 4, Index 15

The infamous COAL HOLE. A long par 4 with the fairway sloping severely from left to right toward the coal hole. A semi-blind tee shot from the Men's tees to a left-to-right sloping fairway can turn a fade into an Easter egg hunt. The line from the tee is the left tree line. Long hitters can clear the dogleg 150 metres from the green. Cut tee shots are severely punished on this hole. The elevated green slopes slightly from left to right toward a bunker at the middle right of the green. The back and front right of the green presents tricky slopes. A false front catches out many good looking shots into this green.

17th 272 Metres
Par 4, Index 9

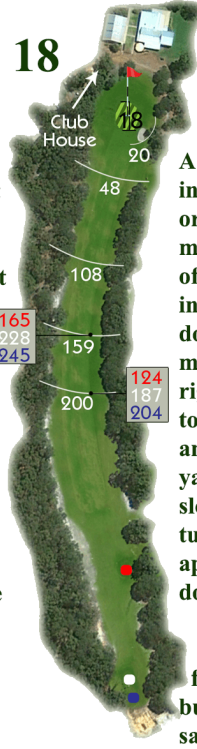
A short and straight, uphill par 4 looks easy enough but is a challenging hole. The fairway slopes right to left with a bunker to the right at the top of the hill. Judging your distance on your second is vital to this two-tiered green, guarded by another hungry bunker on the left, it requires accurate reading to avoid three puts, especially putting from one tier to another. Tip: Aim slightly right since the up-hill lie brings the bunker into play. An interesting feature is that the green is located over an underground cave.

18th 387 Metres
Par 4, Index 7

A stunning and challenging hole. The pleasant panoramic views from the tee mask the subtle difficulty of this longish par 4 finishing hole. The downhill dogleg right fairway slope moderately from left to right. The approach shot to the green is deceptive and plays shorter than the yardage suggest. The sloping green complex can turn an under clubbed approach shot into a double bogey.



The very fast green slopes severely downhill from left to right. A grass bunker to the left and a sand bunker at the front right of the green complete this difficult hole.
