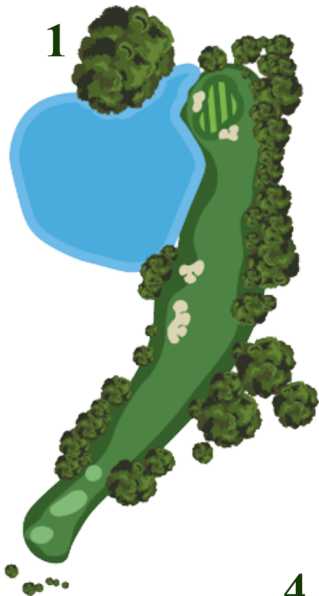


Sanctuary Golf Course



1

**1st 326 Metres
Par 4 Index 5**

Hole one is tough starting hole from an elevated tee the fairway doglegs to the left. Trees to the right or if you hit it straight and too far but with Water all down the left side it's a safe bail out.
Pro's tip: Fairway is the key to playing this hole well. With large fairway bunkers the place to avoid a lay up would be the safe option or for the big hitters carrying the bunkers would put you in prime position.



2

**2nd 292 Metres
Par 4, Index 9**

Our second hole may seem a short easier par 4 but this is one of the trickiest greens on the course both to hit and putt on.
Pro's tip: Hitting your tee shot down the left of the tee opens up the angle to hit down the length of this green taking the bunker almost out of play. Missing this green will leave you a tough chip from any position.

**3rd 430 Metres
Par 5, Index 17**

The first of 4 par fives on the course, with water down the left and the fairway sloping that way too. A fairly straight hole but bunkers short and either side of the green make the shot into the green a challenge.
Pro's tip: Avoid left off the tee and consider your second shot distance laying up short of both bunkers in front of the green will give you a perfect pitch into a generous green.

**4th 135 Metres
Par 3, Index 15**

A short par 3 surrounded by bunkers front, left and right.
Pro's tip: Do not be a hero, pin position is everything on this green if the flag is right tucked in behind the bunker, my advice aim for the left hand side of the green take a couple of putts and walk away happy.

**5th 332 Metres
Par 4, Index 1**

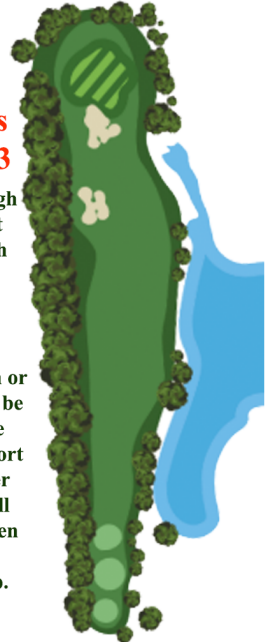
The hardest hole on the course and for good reason. With water left, right and long off the tee, this sharp dogleg left also has water right and short of the green.
Pro's tip: A tough tee shot here, hugging the fairway bunker left leaves the best approach to the green. Hitting it down the right side of the fairway leaves a long second shot bringing the water more into play.

**6th 280 Metres
Par 4, Index 13**

A short par 4 although a generous fairway it will seem tighter with water running the whole length of the right side of the fairway.
Pro's tip: A long iron or fairway wood would be my suggestion off the tee here. Landing short of the fairway bunker would leave you a full shot in. With the green sloping steeply from back to front club up.

**7th 147 Metres
Par 3 Index 7**

The hardest par 3 on the course not only due to length but with huge bunkers in front and one at the back. This huge, sloped green can be up to 4 clubs' difference depending on where the flag is placed.
Pro's tip: Club selection is everything on this hole. Make sure you have enough club to carry the bunkers. Very rare anyone is ever long.

**8th 465 Metres
Par 5, Index 11**

The longest of the par 5's slight left to right straightening out halfway down the fairway. With a small dip in front of the green makes the green seem closer than it is.
Pro's tip: Hit your tee shot towards the right-hand side of the mound just left of the bunkers. If you're long off the tee it will bounce forward and right into the fairway, otherwise it will be safely in the center of the fairway. If you can carry the next set of bunkers the ball should hit the down slope and run up towards the green.

**9th 352 Metres
Par 4, Index 3**

This front nine finishing hole is uphill all the way playing a lot longer than the 383m it says. Safe with no water on this hole but plenty of well positioned bunkers to make up for it.
Pro's tip: hit it as long right of the bunker as you can still leaving a long second shot. Another big green with a two-tiered green slopping from the back to the front. Again, can be a 3 or 4 club difference from front to back.
