# 10th 273 Metres Par 4, Index 18

The start to the back 9 leading you into false pretence, the shortest par guarded by a sundry of bunkers the second shot is an important one here.

#### 11th 318 Metres Par 4, Index 6

A daunting par 4 with water separating the fairway and has to be played over. Having to lay up here makes the second shot longer for the length of the hole.

Pro's tip: Another hole where club selection from the tee is crucial, too long you're in the water, too short and you leave yourself a risk of not reaching the green for your second. There is a lot more room left off



#### 12th 275 Metres

Par 4, Index 16
Another shorter par 4 this time playing slightly uphill with a lot of bunkers guarding the green especially the righthand side. A long green that seems to make it hard to get the ball far enough back.

Pro's tip: Aim left. There are a couple of bunkers to avoid down the left side but getting in any down the right and it makes it very

hard to hit the green in regulation from there. When hitting your second shot always seems very deceptive and easy to leave yourself short, however go past the flag will leave you a very slippery putt downhill.

## 13th 113 Metres Par 3, Index 12

Do not be fooled by this little guy. It may only be 137m long but the smallest green on the course sloping away from you and protected by 4 tough bunkers makes the hole a lot harder than it looks. Pro's tip: Aim for the open part of the green on the left, the righthand side slopes all the way down into a hollow leaving a tough chip. Try not to be short as these are some tough bunker shots.



#### 14th 400 Metres Par 5, Index 5

Although short for a par 5
the fairway bunkers ensure it
plays longer than it should
with some of the largest
bunkers you'll see. The
fairway sweeps around
the left, bringing the
water into play both for
lay up or an attempt

# 15th 342 Metres **15** Par 4, Index 4

A reasonably straight par 4 and much like most of our holes a couple of strategically placed fairway bunkers to a narrower two-tier green surrounded by bunkers. Pro's tip: Hitting you tee shot right of the bunkers should feed back in towards the middle of the fairway. The narrower green makes for a tougher second shot but with a long two-level green distance control is the key.





Most would argue this as one of the hardest holes on the course a three-island par 5 not for the faint hearted. A hole if not played before it is particularly difficult to judge. With water just about everywhere no real safe

Pro's tip: A hole to play sensibly, hit your tee shot as close to the first bridge as you can. Then you have the options of a short iron lay up for your the second or for the longer hitters going for the 3rd island to the green or a short pitch.


## 17th 127 Metres Par 3, Index 10

A daunting par 3 especially from the back tees with water to carry and surrounding the green. A small pot bunker to the right popular for those scared of the water.

Pro's tip: Although

Pro's tip: Although water at the back always club up on this hole.

The green is a lot wider at the back and anything short funnels back to the water.



# 18 18th 349 Metres Par 4, Index 2

Tough finishing hole much like the 9th plays a lot longer playing uphill all the way but even more challenging with water short, left and right off the tee. Even with a good tee shot it will still leave you a long second shot into a fast-slopping green surrounded by deep bunkers.
