

# The Cut Golf Course

**1st Blue 344 Mts**  
**White 325 Mts**  
**Par 4, Index 4**

Fairway bunkers downhill about 220 metres but a solid hit will take you down into a hollow fairway with a short iron to the 3 tiered green, so pin placement and accuracy are the key here.



**2nd Blue 325 Mts**  
**White 306 Mts**  
**Par 4, Index 10**

Our second hole may seem a short easier par 4 an elevated tee gives great views but deep bunkers await your landing zone, laying up might be a better option the green is sheltered and flat so avoid the many bunkers and hit the green.



**3rd Blue 291 Mts**  
**White 280 Mts**  
**Par 4, Index 18**

Another great vista to look at, but a group of fairway bunkers need to be avoided, then a green surrounded by bunkers makes you wonder why this hole is rated easy. A short par 4 but you need to carry the second set of bunkers and run your ball onto the green.



**4th Blue 156 Mts**  
**White 143 Mts**  
**Par 3, Index 16**

More great views but this par 3 needs to be attacked from the back of the green two bunkers next to the green left means a strong mid iron is needed aiming right of the green.



**5th Blue 480 Mts**  
**White 465 Mts**  
**Par 5, Index 14**

From an elevated tee with several fairway bunkers covering the dogleg left, so the sensible approach would be go to the right. You need to be in a good position to carry the next set of fairway bunkers but a flat green offers you a chance of par.



**6th Blue 314 Mts**  
**White 300 Mts**  
**Par 4, Index 12**

A short par 4 from an elevated tee with fairway bunkers left and nasy rough on the right so maybe the driver should stay in the bag and lay up. The green is well protected on the right but it is a large green.



**7th Blue 339 Mts**  
**White 302 Mts**  
**Par 4, Index 6**

A more difficult hole with water right and a fairway bunker left, but you need to open up the green so left is the line. A large flat green awaits so you will need a strong positive second shot aiming left of the green



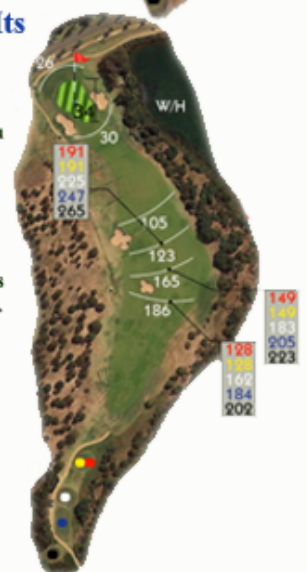
**8th Blue 421 Mts**  
**White 394 Mts**  
**Par 4, Index 2**

A long par 4 with a wide fairway but bunkers lurk everywhere, carry the first fairway bunker then a long iron or fairway club is required to aim left of the green. This hole is rated very difficult so a good drive is essential.



**9th Blue 370 Mts**  
**White 348 Mts**  
**Par 4, Index 8**

An elevated tee but you need to carry the fairway bunkers protecting the dogleg left, the green is elevated so extra care is needed especially with bunkers either side of the green. Running the ball in from the front may be your best option.



- Tees Explained**
- Black = Championship
  - Tour players low handicap
  - Blue = Club Competition handicap used
  - White or Yellow = Guests or Veterans
  - Red = Youth or Ladies

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A blind tee but your drive needs to be left of a slight right hand dogleg. (Don't forget to ring the

bell) once you are playing your second to a flat green protected by two large bunkers right side of the green



An elevated tee to a downhill fairway that needs to be hit as close to center, to take advantage of the slope, a green above you slightly blind so aim for the back of the green not near the greenside bunker on the right. Anything short will be a mistake.



A difficult par 3 you must carry the gorse and scrub to a large green bunkers at the rear mean you will need to judge your club selection. A large bunker short right means that your target is slightly left of the green, the sea breeze can be an influencing factor



From an elevated tee two fairway bunkers await near your landing zone, the fairway is tight and accuracy is a must. The smallest green is protected either side so back of the green is a good option



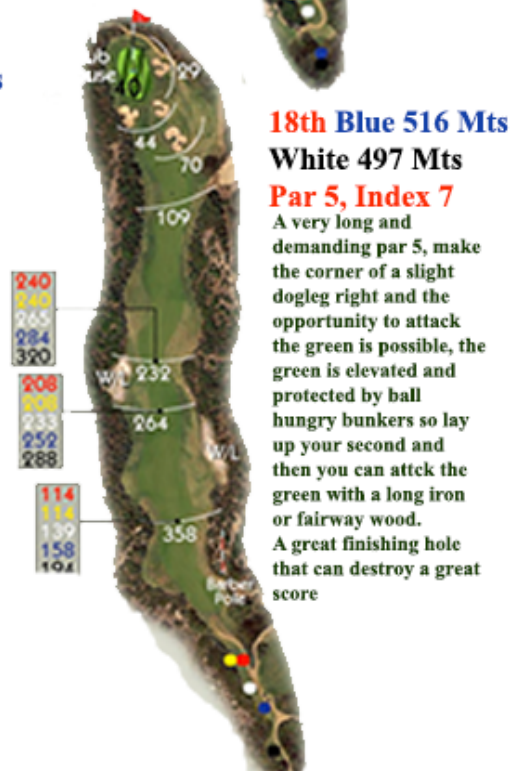
A short par 5 with huge fairway bunkers on the right and scrubby sand left tightens up the landing zone, the green is tucked away tight dogleg right so position of your second shot is essential. The hilly right side next to the green can be a challenge for a poor second shot



From a very elevated tee this par 3 is a great golfers hole the side right slopes into the green but going left the slope will carry you into that ball hungry scrub. A two tiered green may hide the flag from the tee but a brave golfer should make par



A elevated tee to a very tight fairway, accuracy is essential and left is the best side to attack a green that is large and flat. The fairway has high hills either side so this can be an intimidating hole especially if the sea breeze is in



A very long and demanding par 5, make the corner of a slight dogleg right and the opportunity to attack the green is possible, the green is elevated and protected by ball hungry bunkers so lay up your second and then you can attack the green with a long iron or fairway wood. A great finishing hole that can destroy a great score

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
